Key Terms:

- 1. Completers Candidates who finish their degree, pass the licensure portfolio, pass required standardized exams as required by the Vermont licensure board.
- 2. Graduates Candidates who finish their degree.

Vermont Licensure Portfolio

All candidates for licensure in the state of Vermont must submit and pass the Vermont Licensure Portfolio (VLP) as a condition for degree program completion and recommendation for licensure. Through the VLP, candidates demonstrate their progression of learning by addressing their knowledge and skill related to three constructs: 1) learner development and learning environments, 2) content knowledge and instructional practice, and 3) professional responsibility. These three areas contain 10 subcomponents known as the InTASC standards.

Professional Attributes and Dispositions Assessment

University faculty supervisors and classroom mentor supervisors rate student teaching candidates on their professional attributes and dispositions formatively and summatively. UVM candidates consistently score at "target" or "advanced" in all categories. Our benchmark is 95% of candidates at target or advance standing.

PRAXIS II Exams*

Candidates applying for an initial license must take and pass one or more PRAXIS II exams in their content area(s) in order to be eligible for licensure (exception special education).

The number of candidates who took the exams and the institutional pass rates in recent years are reported here. 100% of the 2023 completers required to take this exam for endorsement recommendation passed PRAXIS II. The average scores of our completers generally exceed state and national averages.
